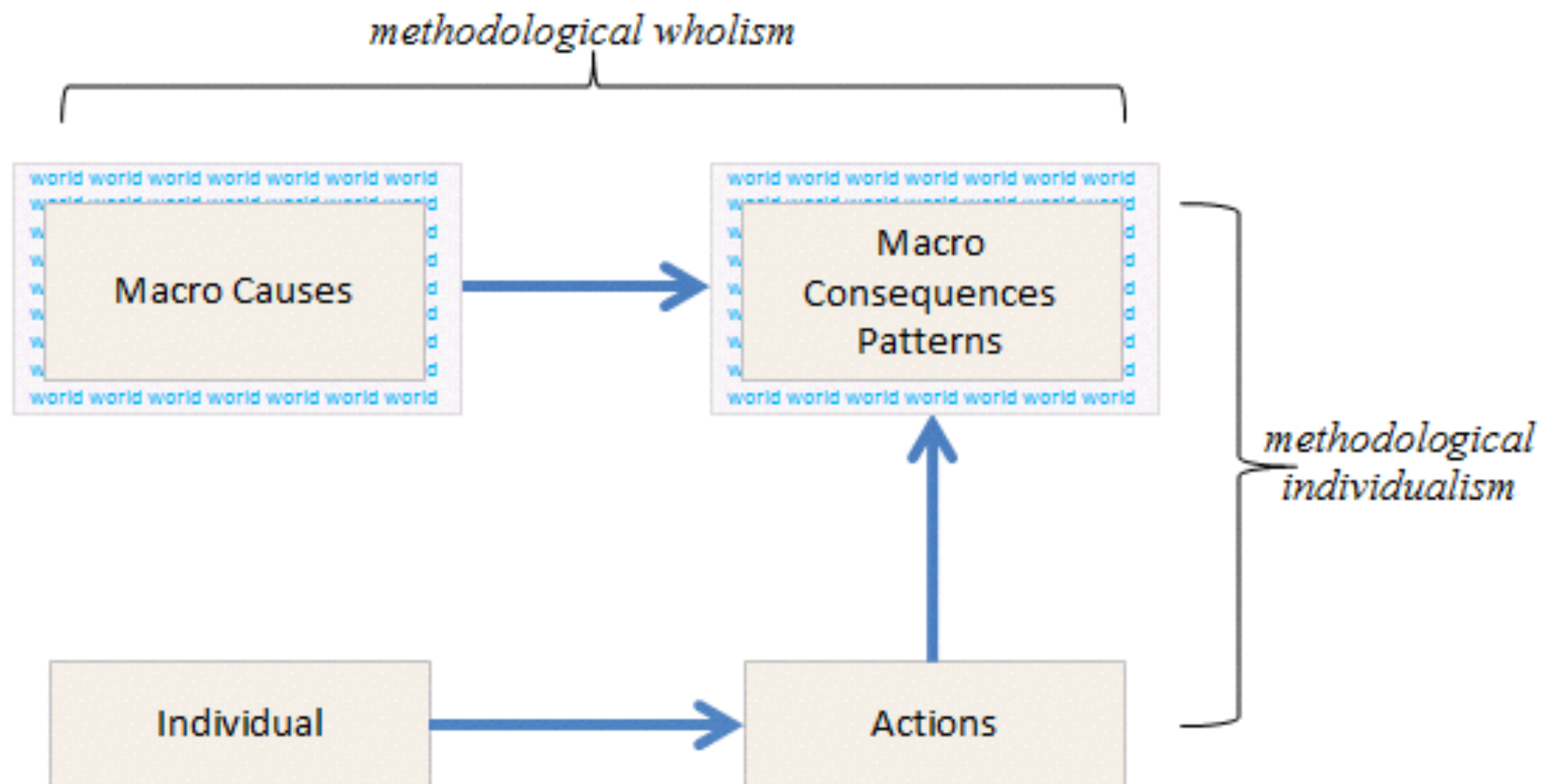
Social facts are the results of the actions of individuals.

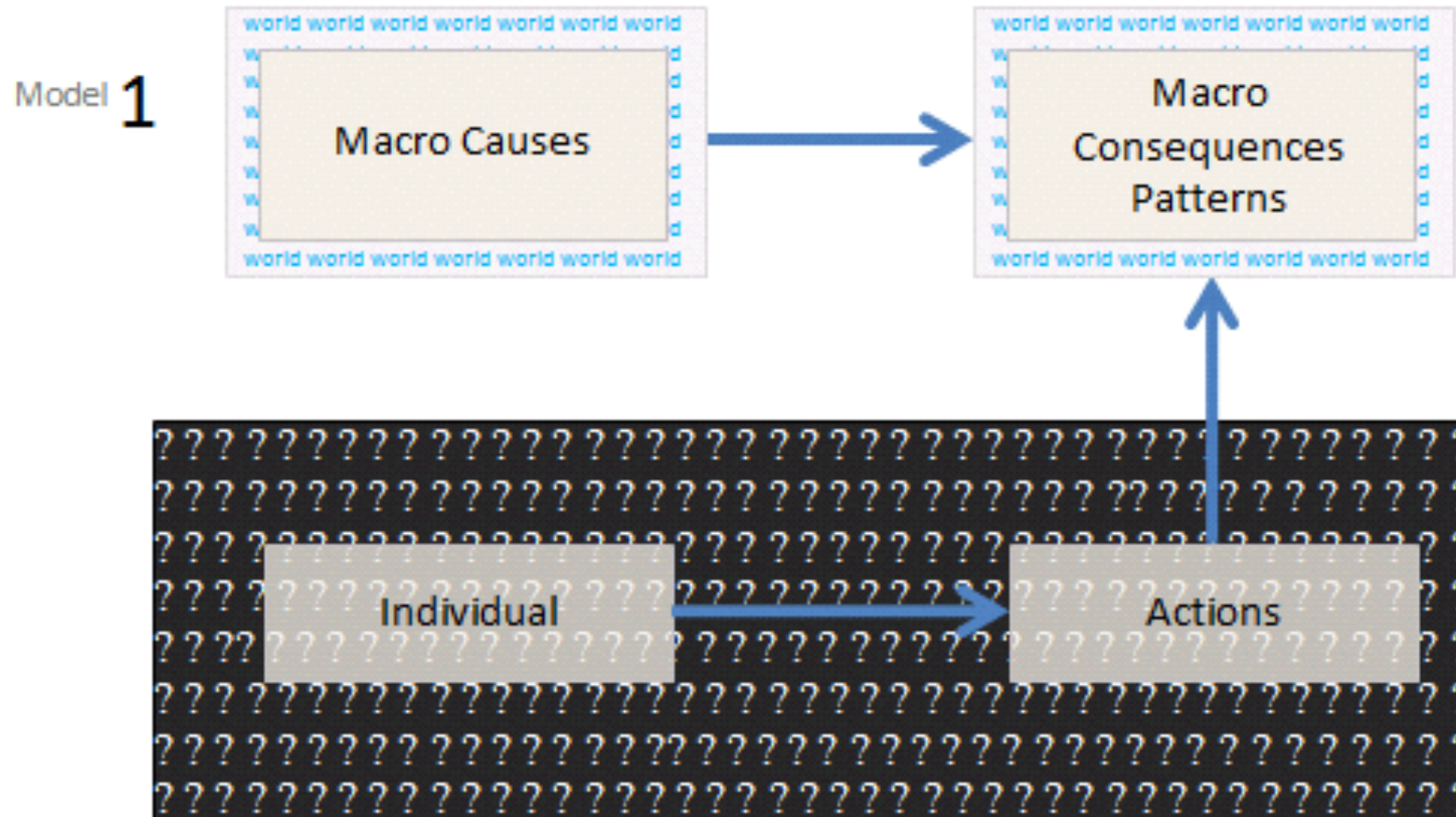

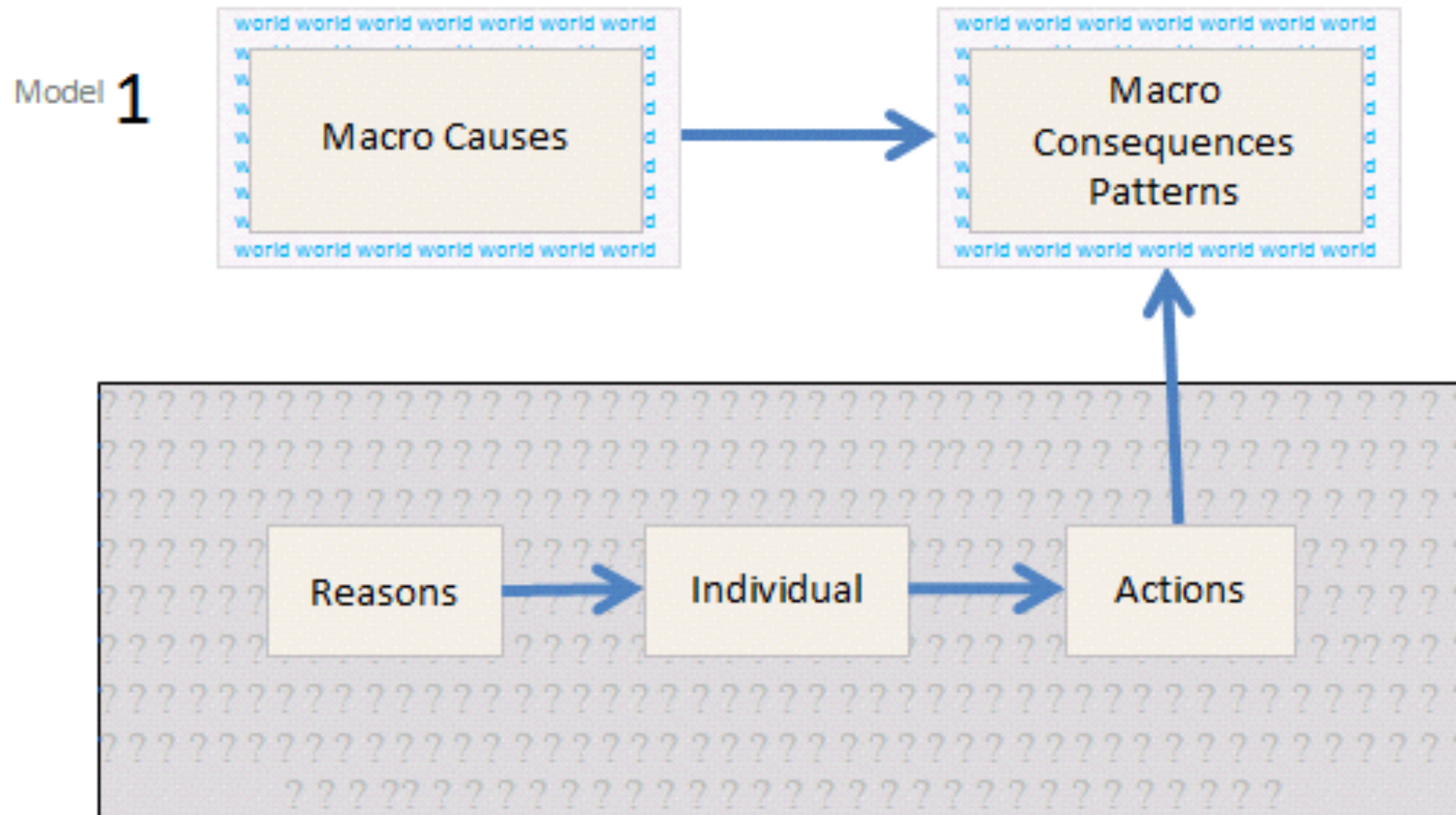

Axiom 1: Individuals act **"for a reason"** – something understandable "causes" individual action

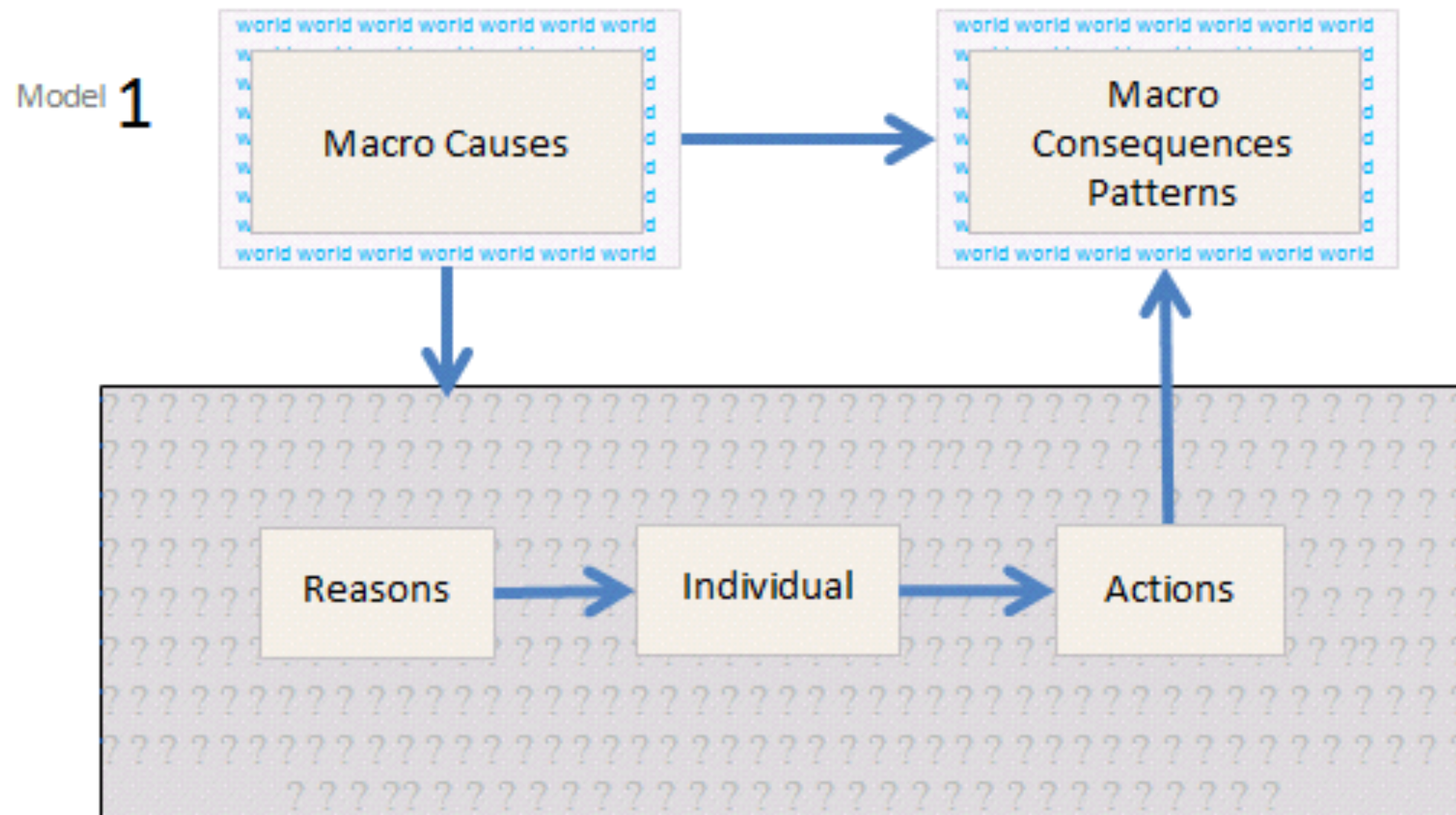

Unpacking the black box of individual action...

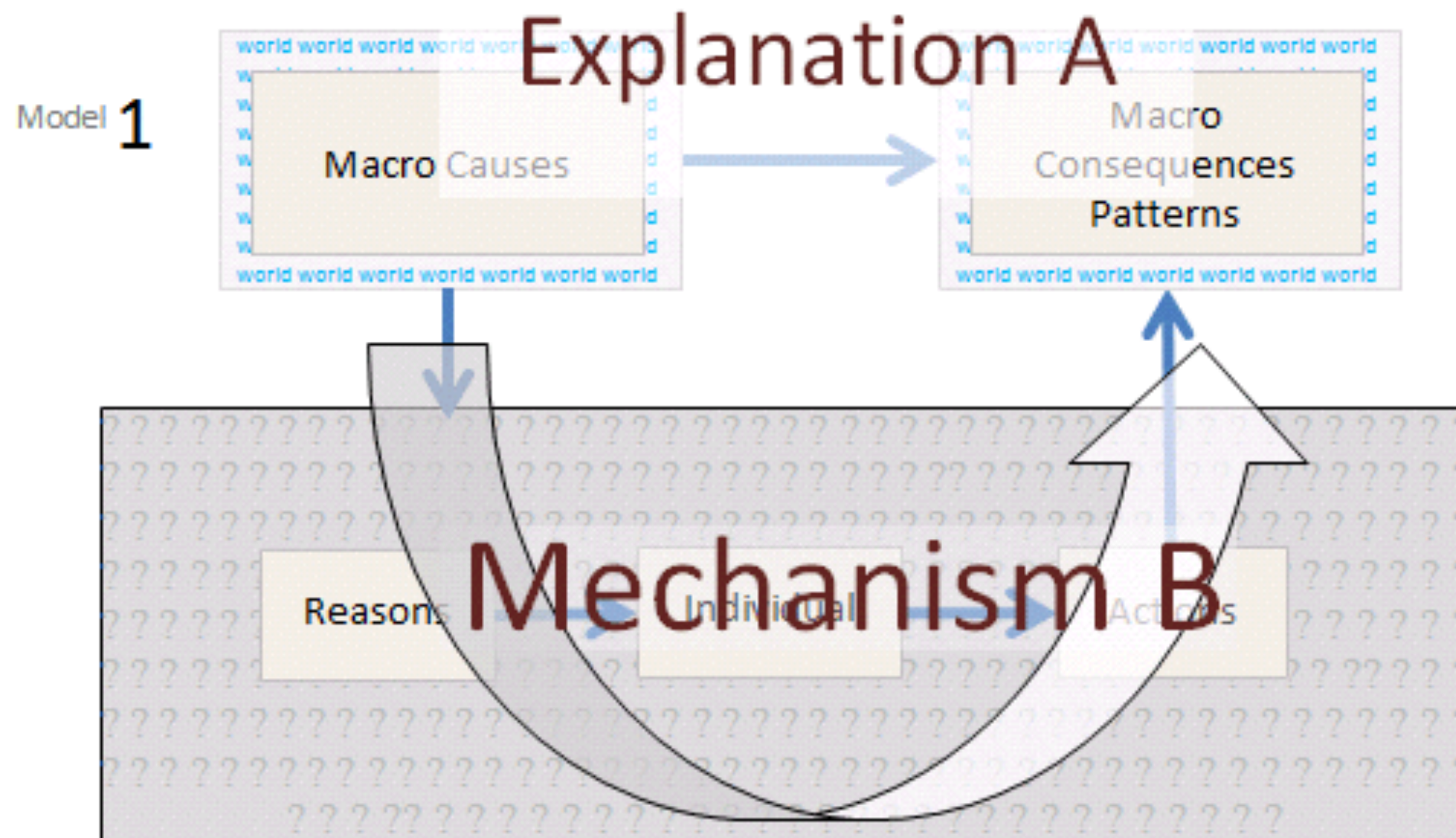
Axiom 2: Individuals are not solipsistic, isolated, disembodied, extra-material entities. They live in world of others and material objects. Their actions change and are constrained by that world

NOTE: The world-reasons-individuals-actions-world path is the *mechanism* behind the macro-causes-macro-consequences explanation

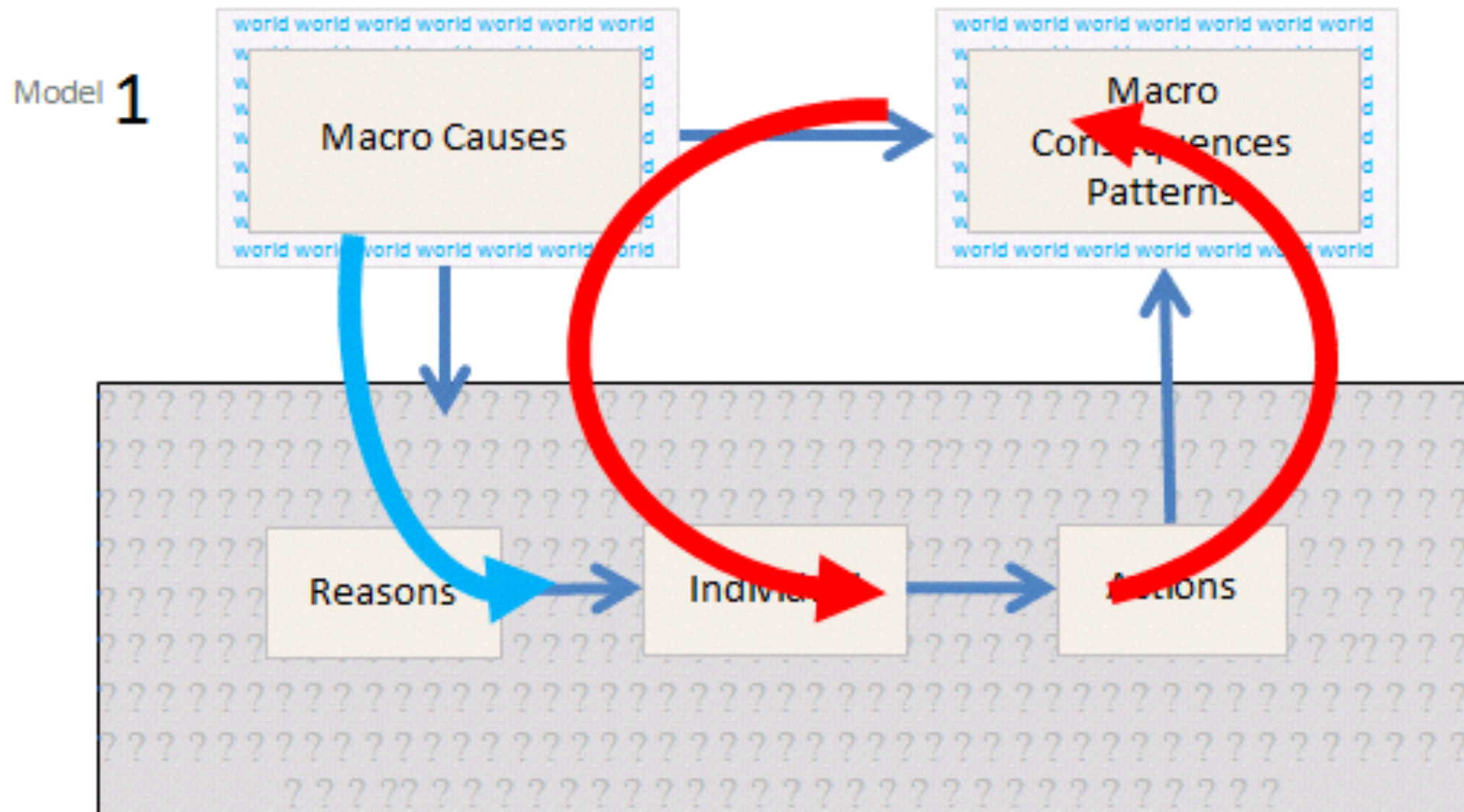

Unpacking the black box of individual action...

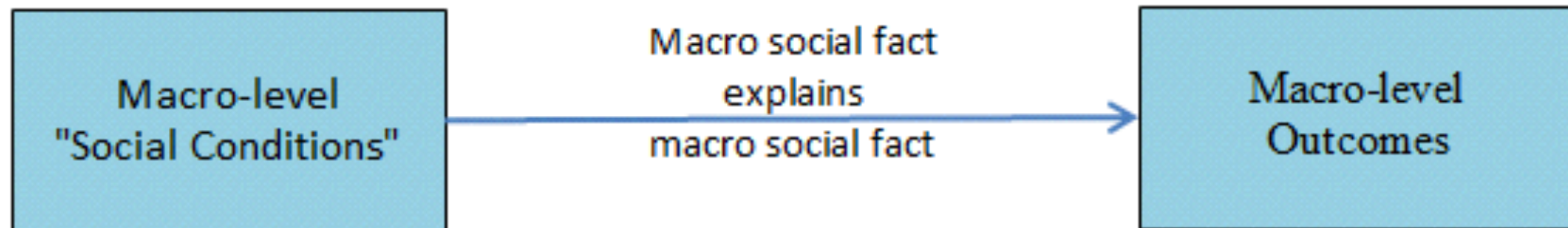
Axiom 1: Individuals act "for a reason" – something understandable "causes" individual action. **"For a reason" can mean "because" AND "in order to"**
